The Department of Pharmacology at Neelima Institute of Medical Sciences organized Pharmacovigilance Awareness Program on the occasion of 4th National Pharmacovigilance Week for BSc Nursing Students on **20th September 2024** with the theme “Building ADR reporting culture for patient safety.” As the Nursing professionals play a crucial role in patient care and drug administration, a special focus was made on Nursing students to have a clear insight on Pharmacovigilance.

The event started with welcome address by Dr Vasavi Patra, Prof & HOD, Department of Pharmacology. Dr B Lakshmi Prasanna, Dean, Neelima Institute of Medical Sciences stressed the need of Pharmacovigilance and motivated the students to take the responsibility of ADR reporting. Dr Rafath Razia, Principal, School of Nursing also emphasized the role of Nursing staff in monitoring drug safety and ADR reporting.
