## **ROLE-PLAY SESSION UNDER AETCOM MODULE**

A Role-Play Session under the AETCOM module was conducted by the Department of Pharmacology, Neelima Institute of Medical Sciences for 2<sup>nd</sup> year MBBS students on 31st June, 1st July, and 2nd July 2025 between 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm. Each batch was divided into groups of three participants, assigned roles of doctor, patient, and patient relative. A total of five topics were allotted to the students.

Following each role play, feedback was provided by faculty and peers in the form of positive points, negative points, and missed points, thereby promoting constructive feedback and reflective learning.
